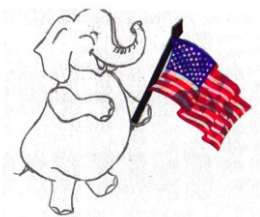

Oregon's Conservative Freedom Rally Recap

The Oregon Liberty Alliance hosted their annual Freedom Rally in Guests and citizens were greeted by about a dozen protestors waving Portland with at least twelve-hundred people in attendance. Russian flags, holding misspelled signs and wearing Putin masks. However inside Patriots and grassroots activists were busy singing God Bless America and standing for the National Anthem. Speakers included Joe Infranco, Congressman Greg Walden, Sheriff David Clarke and Radio Host Dana Loesch. Sheriff David Clarke spoke on the importance of the Constitution and the rule of law. He was disgusted by what the other side is trying to do in dividing Americans instead of promoting Liberty for All.

Conservative Radio Host Dana Loesch spoke last and fired up the crowd with common sense solutions. She said we need more voices not fewer. She spoke on the media bias that has plagued our nation. She talked about the fight that the mid-term elections will be and said we need to be the beacons of culture for liberty and freedom. She talked about the Sweet Cakes by Melissa case and asked Sheriff Clarke if the right to cake was in the Constitution and he replied no it is not.
