## Central Committee Meeting Recap

Central Committee PCPs met on July 13<sup>th</sup> for the quarterly meeting of the CCRP. Chair Hensley gave her report on praising Oregon's 11 Senators who left the state in order to protect us from the terrible effects of House Bill 2020 (Cap and Trade Bill). She issued a challenge to PCPs to recruit one new republican or PCPs for the next meeting to increase our numbers. The group heard a legislative recap from Representative Christine Drazan, more on page 2. Bills recap from Roxanne Ross. We heard a candidate development update from Dave Stewart. We appointed 17 new PCPs. Mark Shull gave update on the new Sandy Oregon Area Republicans (SOAR). Members of the group were appointed as some of the new PCPs. Mike Strickland was a guest speaker and updated the PCPs on his court case and how to protect our rights from government overreach.

## .Legislative Recap from State Representative Christine Drazan (District 39)

Representative Drazan spoke highlighted the committees that she served on during the long session which were Health-Care and Economic Development and the Sub-Committee on Joint Ways and Means for Education. She went into details on the reasons why the Cap and Trade Bill HB 2020 was terrible and would make Oregon unaffordable to live in and raise a family. She spoke on the need to change the makeup of those in power in order to make a difference for those we care about.
