Oregon Republican Party Platform Convention in October Update

At the Central Committee Meeting, the Party elected 17 Bonus Delegates and 10 Alternate Delegates to help shape the 2021-2022 Republican Party Platform. The pre-meetings will start in late August and September with the Convention taking place at the beginning of October. The Party holds this convention every 2 years to work on the platform that is guiding principles set forth by Oregon Republicans. In order to have as much input from Republicans on this document, there are 3 groups of voting delegates. The Oregon Republican State Central Committee, The elected Bonus Delegates and Alternates from all 36 counties and Candidates that ran in the 2020 primary and general election as well as all elected Republicans officials in the State Senate and State House. We can still elect more alternate delegates to be part of the process. Contact us if you would like more information.
